



Academic Endocrinologist

The Department of Medicine, Queen's University, invites applications for an academic position in the Division of Endocrinology and Metabolism. The Division provides consultation care at the University Hospitals, always in conjunction with postgraduate trainees and medical students. The successful candidate will be expected to join the Division in fulfilling its academic and clinical missions within the Department of Medicine. Remuneration and academic rank will be based on qualifications and experience. Candidates must be eligible for licensure in the Province of Ontario. Preference will be given to those candidates who hold or are eligible for certification by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in Internal Medicine and Endocrinology and Metabolism.

Preference will be given to applicants who can provide evidence of a current involvement and commitment to education through the submission of an educational dossier and the identification of referees who can attest to the applicant's educational experience. Applications from candidates who have a successful research experience will also be considered. It is expected that a successful candidate will obtain external grants from peer-reviewed agencies and will contribute to the Division's research activities. Members of the Division have developed individual research grants and collaborative studies with members of the Department of Medicine, other Departments within the School of Medicine and other Schools and Faculties within the University.

Kingston is one of Canada's most beautiful and historic cities, located on the northern shores of Lake Ontario and the St. Lawrence River. The city is midway between Toronto and Montréal, at a distance of about 2 ½ hours from each. It also lies two hours from Canada's capital, Ottawa, and is just a 20 minute drive to the American border.

Queen's is one of Canada's leading universities with an international reputation for scholarship, social purpose, spirit and diversity. All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply. However, Canadian citizens and Permanent Residents will be given first priority.
