

**Head, Department of Oncology  
Queen's University and Affiliated Teaching Hospitals

Applications are invited for the position of Head of the Department of Oncology at Queen's University and Kingston General Hospital and Hotel Dieu Hospital, fully affiliated teaching hospitals. We are searching for an academic physician who is engaged in the practice of oncology with proven administrative experience and leadership skills who, as Head, will draw on strong interpersonal and organizational skills to develop and manage teams that will foster excellence in teaching, patient care and research within the Department and the region. The qualified applicant must be eligible for licensure in Ontario.

The Department of Oncology is housed primarily in the Cancer Centre of Southeastern Ontario at Kingston General Hospital which is currently undergoing major redevelopment and enhancement. The Department fulfills its clinical role through the provision of multidisciplinary, comprehensive cancer care with core programs in radiation oncology, systemic and surgical treatment, palliative medicine and supportive care, prevention and screening, and surgical oncology. With a complement of eight full-time medical oncologists, six medical physicists and 11 full-time radiation oncologists along with full radiation and medical oncology residency programs, the Department contributes to the undergraduate curriculum as well as to the teaching of undergraduate physics courses, and supports both masters and postdoctoral level students. The Department also benefits from very close interactions with the Queen's Cancer Research Institute, the members of which contribute both to patient care and its overall academic program, particularly research, which includes an active clinical trials program, health services and policy research, and an expanding program in medical physics and imaging.

Kingston is located on the shores of Lake Ontario in the Thousand Islands region of southeastern Ontario and is in close proximity to Toronto, Montreal and Ottawa. Freshwater sailing capital of North America, the city, which combines the charms of smaller city living with the cultural advantages made available by the presence of two universities, a community college and a number of public service institutions, is a highly desirable place to live. Queen's University is consistently ranked as a leader in Canadian post-secondary education and research. Attracting the very best students and faculty, Queen's aspires to become a global leader in these areas.
