



## Orthopaedic Academic Trauma Surgeon

Queen's University, Department of Surgery (<http://meds.queensu.ca/surgery/>) invites applications for a full-time academic orthopaedic surgeon with a sub-specialized interest in trauma. Trauma surgery will occupy the majority of the clinical workload; however, other subspecialty training which is complementary to the mission of the Orthopaedic Division will be considered to fulfill the clinical mandate. The successful candidate will be required to work closely with eleven other orthopaedic surgeons at the Kingston General and Hotel Dieu Hospitals. Applicants must be eligible for licensure in the Province of Ontario and preference will be given to candidates who have specialty certification from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada.

It is expected that the position will commence by July 1, 2012. Applications should include a full CV and the names of referees who can attest to the applicant's clinical and research capabilities. There will be a significant commitment towards research and having an advanced degree will be considered an asset. Applicants must include a description of their research accomplishments and future directions, and evidence of involvement in, and commitment to, medical education.
